Together, we're going to keep all of Suffolk's 45 libraries open, maintain opening hours, replace the mobile libraries, buy new book stock and replace many of the public computers across our sites. Like you, we know that libraries are not just buildings with books. They are so much more. The groups, the learning, the support, the companionships and the warm and safe spaces – they're all features of a modern library service that sits right at the heart of the communities it serves.
