RAG Risk Rating for Winter

Update from ACS

In preparation for Winter, we would like to remind providers that it is good practice to RAG rate customers on a regular basis. Adult Social Care undertake risk assessments for all people we work with using a RAG risk rating. This is used to inform urgent risk management in the event of Business Continuity situations. ASC use the RAG risk rating in the table below and it would be helpful if providers could use the same Risk Rating as it will make it easier to have discussions should this be needed in business continuity situations e.g. extreme weather events.

Red Amber Green No identified specific risks. Able to function Living alone, previous or existing Some of the Red risks, but has additional independently for a short while with no safeguarding concerns, complex needs, lack support network and or has a higher level of immediate risk to health or safety. Able to of capacity, no immediate family support independence. Informal carer reporting make informed decisions about own health and / or informal carer at immediate risk of increasing stress / concerns about ongoing and wellbeing/other support networks. No breakdown (unable to continue caring role) ability to sustain a caring role immediate risks or wellbeing concerns in relation to the informal carer's role Explore all adult's network Support network being contacted to The person accessing their own support Consider immediate provision networks agree plan Daily updates (if appropriate) Family carer able to seek support The adult/ support network making Alerting other services & professionals Scheduled call for review contact if the situation changes (with consent / BI decision) Alerting other services & professionals Directing them to services they can Responses from other services (with consent / BI decision) access independently Reviewing protection measures When unable to put in a plan / safety When unable to put in a plan/ safety measure this should be escalated to a measure to meet need or mitigate risk this senior member of staff for oversight should be escalated to a senior member of staff for oversight immediately

Note: Residential care, Nursing care and Very Sheltered Housing: Adults living in a place where there is support on-site to report on changing situations would be categorised as Green. An exception to this could be if the concern of risk is the setting/ support staff themselves, i.e., the lack of provision of equipment (that is the settings responsibility) is putting the adult at risk.
