

Suffolk County Council meeting Thursday 13 February 2025, vote taken on Agenda Item 7 Revenue Budget 2025-26 and Capital Programme 2025-29.

Proposed by Councillor Richard Smith MVO and seconded by Councillor Matthew Hicks.

Motion Text: Council is recommended to agree the following recommendations of Cabinet which were agreed at its meeting on 28 January 2025:

- a. the Council's Budget Strategy (as outlined in paragraphs 17 to 22 of this report);
- b. the Council's planned revenue expenditure, income and funding as outlined in the 2025-26 Revenue Budget leading to a 2025-26 Budget Requirement of £629,516,892 and the 2025-29 Medium Term Financial Plan as outlined in **Appendices C** and **E**;
- c. an increase in Council Tax of 4.99 per cent for 2025-26, equating to a £78.39 rise for a Band D property, from £1,571.04 in 2024-25 to £1,649.43 in 2025-26. Council Tax comprises an element relating to county-wide services and an element for the Adult Social Care Precept, with the rise consisting of:
  - i. an increase in the Council Tax relating to county-wide services of £46.97 for a Band D property, from £1,352.58 in 2024-25 to £1,399.55 in 2025-26, a rise equivalent to a 2.99 per cent increase in Council Tax;
  - ii. an increase in the Adult Social Care Precept ringfenced to help fund Adult Social Care of £31.42 for a Band D property, from £218.46 in 2024-25 to £249.88 in 2025-26, a rise equivalent to a 2.00 per cent increase in Council Tax;
- d. a Council Tax requirement/total precept on the Collection Funds of Suffolk's District and Borough Councils of £454,787,140 which includes the precept to fund Adult Social Care of £68,897,868;
- e. the Reserves Strategy and reserves plans for the period of the 2025-29 Medium Term Financial Plan as detailed in **Appendix D** of the report;
- f. the Capital Strategy, and Capital Programme for 2025-29 totalling £361,778,000 of which £65,685,000 is due to be spent in 2025-26, as detailed in **Appendix F**, **Section 1 & Section 2** and **Appendix G**);
- g. the Minimum Revenue Provision Policy, Treasury Management Strategy, Prudential Indicators and Investment Strategy (Appendix F, Section 3, Section 4 & Section 5);
